A Note from Ben Brustkern, Executive Director

Grants Pass! What does this mean to you? I can tell you it means a lot to us at Friends of the Family.

On June 28th the United States Supreme Court ruled in favor of Grants Pass, Oregon and opened the door for unhoused people sleeping on public property to be fined and jailed. The fear of cities and states across the U.S. following this trend is real and does not help keep HUMANS living outside safe or move in the direction of housing. Let me remind you that housing is the only solution for homelessness.

So now what?

We need your support to help humanize people living unsheltered. We need your support to help create more housing opportunities through donations and volunteering. We need your help to ensure that communities do not treat people living outside as if they don't belong. We need your voice to speak up if our communities choose a path of criminalization.

Being homeless is not a choice. Rent has skyrocketed across the nation and communities do not have enough housing available to meet the needs of the population. As the wealthiest country in the world, it is time for us to stand up and decide that we want to end homelessness and ensure that housing is a human right for all.

Grants Pass and criminalization is not the solution. Housing is the solution.

Staff had a great day as a team at this years Staff Skip Day! We spent the day at Backbone State Park, enjoying the beautiful weather and time together. Check us out in the picture above!

Caitlyn, Service Access Manager, shared that the new permanent supportive housing program, Always Home, has housed 9 out of the 11 spots available. This is exciting as this program only began in January of 2024.

Our team also shared that this year's winter Point In Time or PIT Census was the largest one we have ever had! We had 53 staff, volunteers and community partners that went out in 20 different counties to connect with people who may be experiencing homelessness. This is to ensure people are able to access the resources they may need and provide them with a few essentials such as hygiene items, food and water.

The Friends of the Family Admin Team have been working hard auditing files to ensure that funds are being allocated correctly and no errors have been made. This is hard work behind the scenes and makes a big difference at the organization!

A YEAR OF VOLUNTEERS

During this last fiscal year, Friends of the Family had a goal of 7,700 volunteer hours. We are excited to share that we met that and then some! Our Volunteer Manager Madison, along with community organizations and businesses, were able to provide so many great opportunities for our volunteers.

This fiscal year ended with 7,831.67 hours given by 349 volunteers! That's 7,831.67 hours that our amazing volunteers, interns, and community gave to Friends of the Family. - 463 households were moved into housing
